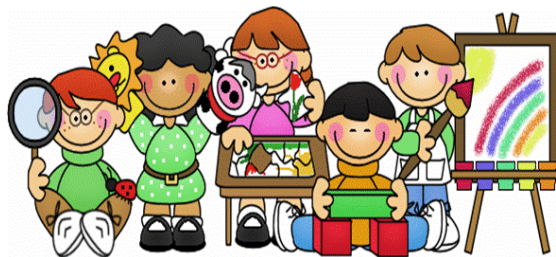

Program Overview for 5-10 Year Old Students

Daily Schedule:

Morning Meeting: This is our daily morning “kick off” assembly. All children will gather outside on the patio with singing, pledge, and our school cheer (selected by our campers on our 1st day). This is a great bonding time for everyone. The school age campers may perform on occasion for the younger children during this time.

Outdoor Sports and Activities: The following activities will take place: kick ball, whiffle ball, relay races, croquet, soccer, bean bag toss, horseshoes and others!

Gardening: Our campers will take turns caring for our school's organic garden, watch its growth and record its growth daily in their science journals.

Summer Reading: Campers will spend time reading 15 minutes daily. They will also write about what they have read in their journals and answer simple questions to promote understanding of what they read.

Indoor Competitive Sporting: These team competitions are enjoyed through cup stacking, Rubick's cube and knock hockey games.

Sewing: Campers will enjoy simple sewing projects like making a pillow or stuffed animal.

Character Building through Bible Examples: Mrs. Carey leads this group discussion and sing-a-long. We will talk about respecting others, being kind, friendships and what the bible says about these topics. A bible verse will be reviewed and a prize given on Fridays when memorized.

Field Trips and Swim Day: Permission slips will be sent out to you later this season. Trip dates and permission slip due dates are on the calendar. On swim day, children will leave at 9:00AM. Please have your child wear their camp T-shirt. We will pack snacks and a drink and return for lunch at 12:00 noon. There is an extra charge to participate. Children not attending will remain at the school for in-class activities.

Meals and Snacks: Our homemade, nutritious meals are prepared fresh daily. You can find a monthly menu in the hallway in front of the kitchen area. Students may bring additional nut-free, healthy snacks such as yogurt or fruit if they desire additional or different snacks than what is offered. Please have your child bring a reusable water bottle since we will bring these outside to the playground with us to stay hydrated.

Water Play: On certain scheduled mornings or afternoons (see camp calendar) each classroom will play in the sprinklers, at water tables and participate in fun water games. If your child is scheduled in the morning have them wear their bathing suit. If he or she is scheduled for afternoon water play have them bring their suit. All students should bring a towel and water shoes.

Game Time: Assorted games such as: Knock Hockey, Uno, Connect Four, Monopoly, and digital games will be available for all children. Board and other games from home are allowed to be shared with their class.

Electronics Policy: Students who choose to bring in an electronic device do so at their own risk. ABLC is not responsible for a lost, stolen or broken device. The following guidelines must be followed: Only games, music, pictures, and movies rated for everyone are permitted (no exceptions). Time of use will be established by the teacher. Students may not walk around with devices in their hands or pockets. If misuse or arguing between students and/or ABLC staff is a result of an electronic device, the device must be put away for the day (no exceptions). Internet use without teacher supervision is not permitted. Social media is not permitted. Wifi is not available for use at ABLC. ABLC tablets are available for use.

- **SUMMER PROGRAM PAYMENTS/DEPOSITS/REFUNDS:** There is a \$50 registration fee for those NOT enrolled in our regular school year. To ensure a high quality summer program a deposit of \$500 must be paid at time of registration. Prior to May 1st, cancellations will incur a \$250 administrative fee. After May 1st, absolutely no refunds will be given.
- **YEAR ROUND PROGRAM PAYMENTS/DEPOSITS/REFUNDS:** A one month security deposit is required to hold a spot for your child. Security deposits are refunded when 30 days of written notice is given. New applicants must give 60 days of written notice; otherwise a refund will not be given. Payment is due the first of every month. Enrollment is for an entire school year (September through August), including summers and holidays.
- There will be a 10% price reduction for the 2nd child in the family (discount is not applicable for CIT students). Reduction applied to lower monthly tuition.
- No credit will be given for illness, holidays, vacation or absence.
- Enrollment is accepted on a first come, first serve basis.

DISCIPLINE POLICY CONTRACT FOR CAMPERS 5 YEARS AND UP

Apples and Books Learning Center (ABLC) Summer Camp Program strives to create an environment in which children are encouraged to develop an appreciation of their own rights and the rights of others. Each camper is helped to understand the impact of behavior as it might affect others. The campers are encouraged to express their opinions and feelings appropriately. They will also be encouraged to use constructive means to settle disagreements or problems.

Children need to know the rules if we expect them to abide by them. At the beginning of the camp season, the campers, together with the staff, will review the rules. As a result, the campers will know what is expected of them and will understand what is appropriate behavior for themselves and for others, resulting in a safe camp program.

Campers have a responsibility to exhibit self-control on school property and field trips. This can be accomplished if all campers:

- Stay with assigned counselor unless asked otherwise**
- Remain within the area assigned for a specific activity**
- Maintain and respect ABLC property and the property of others**
- Speak to and treat counselors, personnel and other campers with respect**
- Refrain from using inappropriate or foul language/gestures**
- Avoid placing themselves and others in danger or physical harm**
- Refrain from deliberate or intentional hitting, touching and bullying**
- Refrain from the use of the internet without teacher approval and supervision**
- Refrain from bringing in any inappropriate or unapproved material**
- Follow ABLC policies**

Campers who choose not to accept these responsibilities are subject to disciplinary action, which includes:

- Verbal warning**
- Time-out from activity**
- Written incident report and parent notification**
- Conference between camper, counselor, site leader and parent**
- Suspension of 1-2 days, depending on severity of incident**
- Expulsion from program**

Consequences will vary according to the frequency, severity, and nature of the incident. No refund will be issued if a camper is dismissed.

Discipline Policy:

There shall be no hitting, corporal punishment, abusive language, ridicule or harsh, humiliating or frightening treatment, or any other kind of child abuse or neglect. Our methods of guidance and support shall be positive and consistent with the developmental needs of each child. Children shall not be isolated without adult supervision. Discipline will be consistent. Discipline shall not be associated with behavior of children in regard to rest, toileting or food. When a child is not cooperating in the group, we will call attention to children who are good listeners and are cooperating (positive reinforcement). If the child continues to be uncooperative, the co-teacher will sit with the child in the group. If the negative behavior persists, the child will be removed from the group and placed elsewhere within the classroom. Parents will be informed if negative behavior persists.

Expulsion Policy

This 5-week swim program held at the Deer Path YMCA in Flemington is for children 3 years old and up (must be in the Apples class and fully toilet trained). It starts on Friday, July 19, and ends on Friday, August 16. For children 3 and 4 years old, the class will include 45 minutes of swim instruction. For children 5 years old and up that do not need flotation devices, the class will include 45 minutes of swim instruction and 15 minutes of free swim.

This optional program includes swim lessons, showers, lifeguards, pool toys/flotation devices, transportation on a school bus with seat belts, a weekly trip to the park (weather permitting), and morning snack.
